




Yours Truly's frequent computer malfunctions, repairs and purchases, and our first graphic designer's huge hourly rates increases nevertheless, resulted in our repository of approx. 100 Black businesses, educators, artists, authors, inventors and others, including AWS Mining, Edison Ballroom, WFWP among multi-cultural Record Breakers' in this issue. Astounding headlines and releases arrived describing Blacks' trend-setting inventions and services, also improving millions of lives. Unlike thousands of our Black wise, skillful, indigenous ancestors and slaves, rarely adequately compensated, nor publicized for their fine contributions, today's Black Record Breakers are respected, recognized, paid and celebrated.

Our passion included exceeding our standard 48 pages to 60, due to our second graphic designer's refusal to re-paginate, upon reducing too large fonts for magazine publishing. Yet the excitement of Black Record Breakers includes support from wise Dante Lee, CEO and President of Black News.com, who's wealth of publicists' Black clients, seeking coverage, also became our *dream come true* news service. Mind boggling, stories about contemporary Blacks also arrived from BlackDocs.org., Blavity, EUR Web, Black Good News and New York's Museum of Public Relations. To date, Tri-State New York's iconic Black publicists, namely, Terry Williams, Pauline Whitfield, Irene Gandy, Victoria Horsford, Flo Anthony, also Black Noir Magazine publisher, Bob Tate, former Black Elegance Magazine publisher, Don Thomas, Rachel Noerdlinger, Shirley Scott, Mark Nobles the Black PR Society, etc. saturate Black media with distinguished Blacks.

Ten years ago, my Black History awareness increased, as executive producer for Staten Island, NYs spoken word artist Dow Kevin Buford's Black Innovations that Built this Nation CD, citing 100 inventions by Blacks. His CD inspires listeners and fans dancing to historical Black Innovations that Built this Nation's R&B, jazz and light hip-hop recorded beats, as his baritone-based voice resonated his spoken words. Buford's CDs and personally designed posters, listing 100 inventions by Blacks frequently sold out during his standing ovations' performances at schools, theaters, churches community and detention centers.





Sharpton presents NANs \$5,000 check for slain NYPD Officer Familia's Children in 2015

Rev. Sharpton's leadership trajectory began as the youngest, age 10, youth minister, at the Brooklyn New York church his family attended. His commitment to eradicating racial voting rights illegalities, may have germinated as a 14 year old, youth director, for Brooklyn's Congresswoman Shirley Chilsom, also the first female U.S. Presidential candidate, and as a 16 year old, youth director for Rev. Jesse Jackson's non-profit.

On a Saturday afternoon in July 2018, at NANs Harlem-based House of Justice packed house guests routinely gathered for Rev. Sharpton's weekly No Justice No Peace live broadcast rally. That was the day when Dr. Alvin Ponder, VP of NAN NYCs Chapter enthusiastically agreed with my mention that Rev. Sharpton, would be NYGBs 21st Century Renaissance Record Breaker.



By December, 2018, in the midst of this delayed issue, as explained in our Publisher's Statement, I was shocked by those clueless pundits' response to Rev. Sharpton's news headlines, about the sale of his book to NAN, which in their opinion, was too meager. Likewise, they were more startled by his second announcement, regarding the current negotiations for his documentary and major motion picture film. They'll learn how they underestimated Rev. Sharpton, the sought after quintessential minister, also respected by literary, media and film industry celebrities and executive producers. Perhaps they're unaware of NAN as North America's leading *Go To Organization*, when alarming racial incidents and tragedies occur.

Rev. Sharpton and his non-profit's popularity soars each year, upon welcoming free of charge, thousands of nonmembers at NANs Annual Convention, held at New York's luxurious Sheraton Center. There, thousands of NAN members. VIPs, sports and entertainment celebrities arrive in droves. Some of them experienced standing-roomonly accommodations also at NANs crowded room plenary sessions, criminal justice reform, corporate diversity and employment, education, economics, health care, housing immigration, voting and evangelist, gospel singer Dorinda Clark's spiritual revival in 2018. NYGB has not exploited attending those vitally important forums at least two days in a row, given our staff shortage; soon to increase.

'Do not talk with food in your mouth," exclaimed Rev. Sharpton, over loud speakers inside the elegant Sheraton Hotel banquet room, as hundreds of guests chatted and devoured themselves with savory braised salmon or fillet mignon meals. Celebrating the life and legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. since 1968, at NAN'S 2018 Keepers of the Dream Awards' recognition and award gala, honorees were Brooklyn's Christian Cultural Mega-Church's Pastor Rev. A.R. Bernard; rapper Common; Richelieu Davis, Owner of Essence Magazine and Sudial Brands; Kerry Kennedy, President of Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights; MSNBCs Joy Reid; Robert F. Smith and CEO/Chairman Vista Equity Partners. VIP and guests speakers included: Martin Luther King, III; U.S. Atty. Gen. Eric Holder, Rev.William Barber, NYCs First Lady Chirlane McCray; Academy Award nominee Samuel Jackson, stage, screen and singer icon, Harry Belafonte Academy Award winner film titan Spike Lee; Essence Magazine Emeritus Editor-in-Chief Susan Taylor; MSNBCs Chris Hayes and Chris Matthews, DNCs President Tom Perez.

It's not frivolous to suggest captivating Rev. Sharpton, as the Godfather of Social Justice's

power minister, who's book, documentary and major motion picture bio has great potential, also as a tv series. Here's lies an enthralling reference to how Rev Sharpton and the late Canon Baptist Church Pastor, Rev. Dr. Wyatt T. Walker, also Dr. King's Strategic Civil Rights Minister, as NANs first Chairman in 1991 established NAN. 1999 was the year that Dr. Franklyn Richardson, Pastor of Mt. Vernon's Grace Baptist Church, became NANs Board Chairman.

Strategically, Rev. Sharpton's organization would thrive with Dr. Martin Luther King's Civil Rights' blueprint non-violent social justice for Blacks and other minorities. NAN quickly became a dignified, awesome non-violent entity after several Bensonhurst, Brooklyn's teenagers tragically ended Yusek Hawkins life. NANs 17 extensive anti-racism protests marches ceased after Rev. Sharpton was critically harmed by a 27 year old drunk man.

In 2001, to stop the U.S. Military's bomb testing in Vieques, Puerto Rico, Rev. Sharpton with Robert Kennedy, Jr. and a few protesting politicians were arrested. Though they were sentence 30 days, Rev. Sharpton spent 87 days in a Brooklyn jail. NAN and Rev. Sharpton's supporters were not pleased with reports regarding his strict self-imposed jail food fast. A Puerto Rican judge imposed more jail time for Sharpton, citing his previous NYC protests record. I reluctantly accompanied one of his male members, also my public relations client, after awkwardly watching them protest so long. Finally, I realized that Rev. Sharpton and NAN, are legally non-violently fighting for the present and future of justice for Blacks and others. By 2003, Puerto Rico's Governor agreed with U.S. President Bill Clinton to stop U.S. Military bomb testing in Vieques.

Nor did he press charges against that Black 1980s Civil Rights leader whom, I, among millions, watched attack Sharpton live, during Morton Downy's popular broadcast TV show, due to Sharpton's pro-reparations views. Back then,

Sharpton was frequently interviewed on Host Bob Law's WWRL Night Talk Radio and explained his relationship with the legendary Godfather of Soul James Brown, for which his trade mark hairstyle (currently modified) denotes his respect for Brown, who encouraged Rev. Sharpton's Civil Rights activism. Brown became a mentor, whom Sharpton met as a friend of James Brown's son, who passed. His first wife Mrs. Kathy Sharpton, is a former background singer for James Brown's band. Since NANs early days, Rev. Sharpton and Mrs. Sharpton's daughters grew up with NAN, and are among NANs management staff. The Sharptons welcomed their first grandchild in January 2019, two days before draft printing NYGBs delayed Dec. 2018 issue.



The August 8, 2017 merger between Black billionaire, Robert L. Johnson's RLJ Lodging Trust's 122 premium focused and compact service hotels in 21 U.S states, plus Washington D.C., and FelCor Lodging Trust's, 35 primed upscale, globally renowned hotels, and premier independent hotels was historic. Currently headquartered in Bethesda, Maryland RLJ Lodging Trust's 157 combined properties still operates with Robert L. Johnson, the African American Executive Chairman and Co-Founder, of RLJ Lodging Trust.

RLJ Lodging Trust, a leading hotel lodging trust, publicly traded NYSE;RLJ stock, since 2011 may own one or more of those Courtyard Marriott, Renaissance, Marriott Hyatt, Hilton and Wyndham hotels' arrival in New York City and elsewhere. The eminent Robert L. phnson is former Co-founder and Chairman of BET, the first Black owned cable TV station, investor and philanthropist. He also owns the Urban Movie Channel's (UMC) streaming network.

The ninth of his parents children, from Hickory, Mississippi. Johnson, has a BA in Social Studies from the University of Illinois, and Masters' in Public Affairs' from Princeton University. He was Public Affairs Director at PBS Broadcasting, Communications Director for the National Urban League, Press Secretary for U.S. Congressman Walter Fautnroy, Vice President for the National Cable and Television Association.

About 17 years have passed since my peers and colleagues overlooked celebrating Robert's \$3 billion BET sell to Viacom. His legacy as the first Black billionaire occurred about a year after the late Reginald Lewis' astounding \$2 billion dollars Beatrice Foods' purchase. We were among persons periodically airing thoughts about our quests for diverse BETTV programs. We under-estimated the value of the immense \$3 billion dollars Johnson received for selling BET, oblivious to that 99.9% of the world's population, who will never envision, earn or received a \$3 billion purchase nor gift. I was another Black press writer, who recollected that bitter-sweet 1970's era, when some major Black hair care and other firms were sold to billion dollar corporations.

Through 2005, Johnson serving as BET'S Co-Chairman, helped expand BET's programming. In 2007 his \$30 million investment in Africa's Entrepreneurial fund, was for the creation of more entrepreneurs from the Liberia. As the first Black owner of a major sports franchise, Johnson sold his Charlotte Bobcats sports franchise to NBA Star Michael Jordan, He charitably assisted actor Morgan Freeman's preparation for the Bahama's 2011 Hurricane, and his fashion tie lines raised capital for a Malaria fund.

In August 2017, three months later after Yours Truly stopped emailing and calling RLJ for an interview, and exhaustively working on NYGB business until nearly 6 am, I was awaken by my ringing phone, about two hours later. An RLI

businessman on the line was responding to NYGB'S telephone and email requests for an interview. Unable to conceal my fatigue, and search for my appointment book, I apologetically told him that we'd call back to schedule an interview. Our hectic schedule resulted in my decision to have a NYGB writer interview Mr. Johnson. She called to no avail.

HR 1242 400 YEARS OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY COMMISSION ACT




Between Dr. King's Birthday Holiday and Black History Month 2018, while enroute to NYS' Senator Hamilton's Black History in Public Schools' rally at Brooklyn's Dr. Betty Shabazz's school, I was determined to participate. The rally would feature Malcolm, the proud NYC Black teenager, recently appearing in the news, since his teacher reprimanded him to never wear his Malcolm X teeshirt to school again. Suddenly my cell phone video featured a Black middle age woman, somberly announcing this as important day, for Blacks. She cautioned how Blacks should concern ourselves with the new HR 1242 legislation. Though designed to help Blacks, she advised us to be skeptical of how HR 1242 should best serve Blacks, because historically, we've been promised great things since slavery, many of which never occurred.

That night, Google's online reports that Robert C. (Bobby) Scott, the Black Democrat Congressional House Rep. introduced and sponsored what may become the most sweeping U.S. Constitutional Law paying tribute to African-Americans' 400 years of slavery via HR 1242's 400 Years of American History Commission Act bill. Congressman Scott's bill evoked the calm after the storm, challenging Congress and the President to critically assess and acknowledge the power of African American ancestors' uncompensated prevailing contributions, upon building America for free, thus creating generations of wealthy non-black business scions.

Specifically, on January 8, 2018, President Trump's final authorized HR 1242 followed U.S, Congressional approval. However, to date, several key sources are vaguely familiar with HR 1242 possibly resulting in a banner 2019th year for African-Americans. Might we consider HR 1242 becoming the literal "olive branch" legislation, thus influencing some our America's top 5% wealthy persons and entrepreneurs to contribute some form of reparations to Black Americans in the aftermath of U.S. Slavery, Jim Crowism, Voting and Civil Rights legislation?

Congressman Scott, never forgot his ancestral Virginia bearings, though Democrats nor Republicans publicly announced HR 1242. His January 8, 2018 HR 1242 Public Law 115/102 bill passed in the House of Representatives with 47 Democrats and 6 Republican cosponsors on May 1, 2017.

The Commission must develop and carry out activities through the U.S. commemorating the 400th anniversary arrival of Africans in the English colonies at Point Comfort, Virginia in 1619, by planning programs to acknowledge the impact that slavery and laws that enforced racial discrimination had on the United States: encouraging civic, patriotic, historical, educational, artistic, religious and economic organizations to organize and participate in anniversary activities; assisting states, localities and non profit organizations to further the commemoration and coordinate public scholarly research on the arrival of Africans in the United States and their contributions to this country.



While others doubted her potential for success, Ellis-Brown deeply realized her resilience, and determination. "Growing up in Detroit, I knew nothing was going to be handed to me. I expected doors to be closed and knew I would need to work hard and never take 'no' for an answer," she said.

In 2008, as a 20-year-old college dropout living in her mom's basement, she endeavored to become her own boss, with a Jamaican Sweet Tea recipe handed down from her greatgrandfather, Cyril Byron, a Jamaican immigrant. At night Ellis-Brown brewed tea in her mother's kitchen, and sold it from a cooler in the trunk of her car around Detroit. She'd returned home every night with an empty cooler and cash - more than enough money to buy the ingredients to brew more tea.

Freddie Figgers, owner of one of the nation's largest privately held African-American cell phone companies and networks, is now competing with the four top largest cell phone corporations. He was an early respondent to Puerto Rico's 2017 Hurricane devastation. The 26 years young man sent 500 satellite phones with unlimited calls, texts and data to help families affected by Hurricanes Irma and Maria. "The hurricane destroyed the entire island's telecommunications' network," said Figgers, 28, founder of Figgers Communications, that designed his phones and developed his network.

"We're trying to do all we can to help these families communicate with each other, and especially their loved ones."

Four years ago, Figgers developed the custom-designed "F1" phone that has automatic anti-texting functionality and super-fast charging. He will release his F2 waterproof and shatterproof phone. Figgers is currently one of the few Black-owned telecoms manufacturing its own phones and providing Figger's services.

Figgers, adopted at an early age, who was found lying by a trash can at two days old, observed Puerto Rico's devastation, as critical, and told himself to do something. Freddie announced "The SIM cards are fully activated for 90 days, free of charge." We all need to do our part to make sure that Puerto Rico gets back on its feet." These SIM cards and phones will be distributed in San Juan to individual families and at San Juan Airport.

At age nine, Freddie, a childhood prodigy, deconstructed a part an old IBM personal computer five times that his father bought at a local Goodwill Store. On the sixth time, he fixed it. At 13, Florida's Net Quincy department hired him as a computer technician and network administrator, setting up the city's network and helping residents. At 16, his Figgers Computers' firm repaired computers and installed wireless area networks. By age 17, his cloud-based hosting design, stored data for more than 70 clients - law firms, car dealerships and dozens of other companies. At 18, he created his own computer operating system.

Figgers' distinctive Voice over Internet Protocol network transmits voice to and from the USA from more than 80 countries' landline and mobile connections.

In 2011, the FCC approved Figgers' application to own Spectrum, resulting in the company's first cellular tower. The company provides cellular, mobile broadband, home phone and international calling services. It uses proprietary 4G LTE Network as wireless communications standard.

Following the recent announcement of basketball star LeBron James' new free I Promise School in Akron, Ohio, James will provide students' free uniforms, transportation, and more, including a food pantry for their family. Unfortunately nearly 110 years passed since Professor Strange and Professor Dillon did likewise, in Kentwood, Louisiana, for The Tangipahoa Parish Training School for Colored - Kentwood's first Industrial Training School for African-Americans is closing. "Today the school is up for auction and has caused a great deal of pain and heartaches for the African American community," said Deon Johnson, Executive Director of O.W. Dillon Preservation Organization. "They're auctioning off our legacy and history."

In 1910, Professor Armstead Mitchell Strange, born in 1884 in Louisiana, at age 18, graduated from Alcorn College. Thereafter, upon visiting the Tangipahoa Parish, in Louisiana Professor Strange, together with several white business owners donated money to establish the first Industrial School for Blacks, in the U.S. The school offered specialized training for students. The professor raised money, purchased and erected the Tangipahoa

Parish Training School for the Colored - Kentwood Industrial School for Blacks.

1911-1912 marked the start of secondary public education for southern Biacks, aiso supported by the Siater Fund's philanthropic fund for the advancement of Negro education. The Tangipahoa Parish Training School for the Colored --Kentwood's first Industriai Training School for African Americans, also named a building after Professor Strange. This school provided teacher training for their graduates to staff Biack schools in southern rural towns. Mainly sharecroppers and farmers' children attended this school. Boys trained and studied scientific agriculture, farming, horticulture and dairying. Giris trained and studied sewing, domestic economy, cooking, dairying, raising pouitry. Genealogy researcher Leonard Smith and historian Antoinette Harreii, reveais Professor Strange, as one of Mr. Tiiiman and Miiiie Hunter Strange's 17 chiidren. His brother Tiiiman moved to Chicago and became a physician. Professor Strange started other southern schoois and coileges, historically permitting generations of Biacks to become educated. In 19'17 Professor Oiiver Wendeii Diiion arrived, assuming control over

one-room, one-teacher, two months a year Kentwood Industrial Training School. With \$1,000 from the Brooks Scanlon Lumber Co. and the Natalbany Lumber Company, he hired three more teachers and extended the school term to a full nine months for 200 students.

In 1919, the school board appropriated \$1,000 to construct a two-story, five-classroom building at the school. Another \$1,200 resulted in purchasing 85 acres of land, adjoining the school. After appealing to a local board to buy a machine, to make cement blocks, Professor Dillion's Black labor force made 40,000 cement blocks, to erect a building to educate area children.

Harrell's research cites Mahalia lackson, the world's greatest gospel icon's performance at the Tagipahoa Parish Training School for Colored -- Kentvvood's Industrial Training school during the 1960s. "A lot work built this school," stressed Deon. "Professor Oliver Wendell Dillon and men of the community made the bricks and mortar to build the school. FIRST U.S. BLACK OWNED, BLOCK CHAIN CRYPTOCURRENCY HEALTH TECH FIRM

At the 2018 National Medical Association's (NMA) 116th Annual Convention attended by hundreds of African American doctors Teledactyl Blockchain, LLC'S health tech block-chain and cryptocurrency company launched its initial coin offering (ICO). Co-founders Alan E. Bottorff and Dr. Seth Crapp joined forces with a group of experts at the Convention. The NMA is the largest and oldest organization serving 50,000 Black physicians and patients. Teledactyl tokens are purchased, traded or exchanged through Waves' platform mobile ITunes App Store or Google Play store, or downloaded for PCs.


"For eight years I've tried to sell the same show, once a week, one hour talk show with comedy and music, to read music," Allen reminisced. "I went around to every syndicator in the U.S." On September 29, 1989 Allen, co-executive producer and host of his pilot series opened in New York, LA, and Chicago, the top three U.S' markets. Allen's show premiered on 155 stations in most U.S. households His 1992 Jammin picked up as Kickin It with Byron Allen, landed on the longest-running U.S. television series list.

He was 14, when Good Times'
Jimmy Walker's impression resulted in hiring him, on his team of young writers, including Jay Leno and David Letterman. Meanwhile Allen, the young comic and former B student, at Fairfax High School in LA, turned A student, at the USC, refused countless offers to write and work in television Education was his priority.

At 18, while in college, Byron worked two days' per week at NBC. His television debut as a hilarious Black motif middle-class comic on Johnny.

Carson's Tonight Show was successful.
Byron co-hosted what became his successful new Emmy nominated *Real People* TV show. Real People's interview episodes were filmed throughout the U.S. during the summer, without hindering Allen's college studies.

Whereas several wine, spirits and beer manufactures are returning as sponsors and vendors during 2017s Black owned Wine and Spirits Festival, tops among them, Chanel Turner, as Event Sponsor is Founder/CEO of FOU-DRE VODKA In 2009 at age 25 Chanel was the youngest femaie owner of her own spirit firm. She's the first Black woman owner-operator of her vodka brand.

The Festival Producers' initiatives to expose more Blacks' alcoholic beverages firms, also refer to the summer of 2015 when digital powerhouse Black Wall Street released 20 Black owned wine and spirit brands, attracting 41,000 Facebook shares within weeks.

This limited six hour gala, minimizes intoxication. Various cuisines are served. Entertainment is also scheduled at this mesmerizing event. The Festival's objectives are to increase visibility and it's awareness of Black-owned wine, spirits and beer companies; provide an organized platform for consumer interaction and education with sampling opportunities and tasting demos and to encourage intro and intra community partnerships and industry alliances.





Specifically, Dedra left her Motown Promotions, Radio and General Manager position, of seven years, before joining Flavor Unit Entertainment position. She's MTV Network's former employee. During her 11 years, as President and General Manager, Tate expanded Latifah's New Jersey based Flavor Unit Productions' Entertainment with tv and film ventures. She's one of a few powerful Black business women, in music, spanning three decades.

Tate helped launched world-famous, musician, composer, arranger and producer Quincy Jones' Vibes Magazine.

Honored among a few *Girls Behind The Mic's* survivors of Hip's Hop's rough era, Tate is a film and tv producer, script writer, artist manager, event planner and columnist for New York Beacon Newspaper. 


MY FABULOUS POST THANKSGIVING AND NEW YEARS' AT THE EDISON BALLROOM

2015 New York Eve, just before 12 midnight, as Joe Battaglia and The New York Big Band dazzled Manhattan's full swing Edison Ballroom, I was inevitably shoved among their crowded aisles and packed floor, while photographing frenzied Black tie and casual garbed guests awaiting 2016's televised "Live in Times Square" gigantic Ball drop. Most of their \$325 per ticket guests had feasted on celebrity chef's Mina Newman's four course seared salmon or herb roasted chicken dinners with asparagus, scalloped red potatoes, desserts and unlimited bar cocktails. I was delighted that Edison's General Manager, Bill Kaelblein had preserved my dinner and fruit souffle cheese cake. Their champagne flowed, as did their near and far traveled, talented Edison Ballroom and Salsa dancers who kept moving, until this lavish New Year's bash ended.

"What goes around, comes around," attests to the grandeur of the huge Edison ballroom established in the 1930's as an Art Deco, "highsociety" elegant ballroom, next door to the Edison Hotel, until decades later, when the Ballroom relocated to Restaurant Row. By 2008 the popular Edison Ballroom returned to its hefty multi-million dollars' elegantly renovated West 47th Street's origin. as an expanded 18.000 sq. ft. entity, with a huge dance floor, VIP and mezzanine seats up to 600 guests, and 1,000 Concert guests.

For more than a decade, Russell Simmons attracted thousands of fans to his Edison Ballroom's RUN DMC, Curtis Blow, LL Cool J, Ashanti, Ludracris concerts. Millions of fans viewers watched Simmons' Comedy Central TV, and Oxygen TV series that filmed Vivica Fox, Amber Rose and numerous A and B Lister's on Edison's premises. Simmons' private Janet Jackson Concert was held here, plus numerous private fundraisers and other events at this historic venue.

Friday, November 27, 2015, I was mesmerized by Edison Ballroom's hazy sky and royal blue stage lighting and fascinated by Joe Battaglia's 16 piece tuxedo attired band during my 1-1/2 hours stay. Donning his White tuxedo, bow tie and black slacks, Joe's iconic portrayal of his trumpet's jazz and pop standards, was as impressive as his band Sinatra, Glenn Miller, Shirley Bassey, Tony Bennett, Count Basie and Nat King Cole among



acclaimed jazz, pop and R&B 20th legends' songs. Vocalist Keren Zobataro's show-stopping Let's Dance, Donna Summers' rendition was followed by songs showcasing her fine background vocals' performances for Macy Gray, Elton John and Alicia Keyes. Some of DLI'S ('Direct Latin Influence") band members play with Ito Quentin, Eddie Ramirez and other Latino jazz legends. Latinos represent Battaglia's and DLI bands' loyal fans, attending the Ballroom's annual Valentine's, Easter's, Thanksgiving's and New Years' Eve galas.

FOODY'S FINAL NEW YORK GLOBAL.BIZ REVIEW

Summer's 2018 arrival of Foody's Dumpling's on 42nd and 41st Streets, on Ninth Avenue, Manhattan already averages 4 to 5 stars ratings on Goggle. They're raving about this clean small efficient affordable dumpling house, where 12 dumplings at \$7.99 is among top menu items and \$1.00 seaweed generous miso soup is a throw-back price treat, for lovers of healthy miso soup. Foody's right side facility's interior features a striking black and white exotic energized human figurative art mural by of New Jersey.

Around 7:00 pm that evening, Daniel the mid-30s owner, who stood in front of the store, pleasantly remembered me and introduced me to his two male employees whom he was orientating to start working on the first day that Foody's expanded its evening hours. As promised, I returned near closing, observing Foody's sporty and business attired customers order take out dishes, while others sat eating at their food bar counters.

The meatiness of my chicken dumplings was unexpected. I was accustomed to eating smaller shrimp and chicken, or shrimps and vegetables dumplings at Chinese restaurants. Daniel explained that the crescent moon shaped dumplings' original

shapes, dates back to centuries ago. He said that China traditionally serves dumplings when celebrating Chinese New Year. He described Foody's vegetarian and other dumplings containing ginger, chives, etc. After tasting one of those 12 chicken dumpling from my package, I was overwhelmingly ingratiated. Yet as an African-American female, I still missed my grandmother's chicken and dumplings, cooked quite differently.

Highlighting family traditions, Daniel was inspired by his parents' former successful long-established Chinatown restaurant. Researched data, among theories, dates back to AD 225 when jiaozi, the original name for northern Chinese dumplings, originated from Zhang Zhongjing, a great Chinese medicine man. During cold winters Zhongjing treated China's poor suffering from frost bitten ears with his remedy stuffed inside a thin crescent moon/ear shaped dough. They too ate dumplings to celebrate the Chinese's New Year. Some Chinese eat their dumplings after their main course. The popularity of Chinese dumplings are served as appetizers, etc.

WHY GALAXY'S AMERICAN CUISINE RESTAURANT, THRIVES AS THE OLDEST NINTH AVENUE DINER FROM W. 36TH TO 56TH STREET FOR 42 YEARS?



Equipped with Free WIFI for their guests, the Galaxy is a comfortable, somewhat tranquil, and sometimes packed busy diner. Among their fine American cuisine foods, starting with breakfast, since my first day in 2003, I'm still stuck on their homemade baked, and largest, moist raisin bran

and blueberry muffins served in NYC'S diners, cafes or restaurants. A few years ago, I stopped modestly eating half or taking half of my muffin home. If I'm having breakfast it'll take about a half-hour to finish my Galaxy's wholesome bran muffin.

For the record: A baked natural healthy muffin's texture is neither soft, nor flaky. Bran's outside crust is firm, but not hard. Refilling our cups with their seemingly gourmet coffee, at no added costs underscores the value of buying a cup of coffee at diners vs. paying full-price for an additional cup of coffee at counter cafes.

In 1981, my preference for bran muffin occurred when I bought my first natural, large healthy muffin from a restaurant at south west 44th St., downstairs from RCA'S Music building in Manhattan. Back then U.S' corporate secretaries and others' day started with bringing eating breakfast, at our desk or a lunch room. After sharing half of my

bran muffin with my co-worker secretary, soon her boss, Ralph Abalone, CEO/Chairman of Ogden's Fortune 500 Conglomerate, at 277 Park Ave., Manhattan, fell in love with that restaurant's bran muffin. For several months before I resigned, my boss, Stanley Frankel, Public Relations VP of Ogden's Fortune 500 Conglomerate, became aware that I was delivering Mr. Abalone's bran muffins that he bought us.

Galaxy's fast paced waiters never somberly arrive at our table. They're pleasant demeanor focuses on correctly taking orders, as waiters accustomed to diners overwhelmed by Galaxy's popular large corn beef or pastrami Reuben sandwiches. Seafood diners may agree that the Galaxy's popular shrimp scampi, served with potatoes or rice, and their mesclun salad or soup, or Alaskan salmon fillet, with lemon and white wine sauce are favorites. Penne a la vodka with either vodka or brandy sauce with chicken, rates high among diners.

Today, 15 years after I began dining here, I've yet to hear two of the remaining owners of Galaxy, describe their Galaxy journey. Prior to the past two decades, Galaxy witnessed the transformation of Ninth Avenue's Clinton Hill's/Hell Kitchen area, into it's current middle-class commercial and residential district where high rents thrive in tenements, luxury, high-rise and commercial buildings. It is the neighborhood where Alicia Keys grew up.

EXHILARATING WORLDLY NEW YORK CITY'S TIME SQUARE



Times Square is similar to a New York City's marathon reality tv show's illuminated tourist landmark, with dominant flashy digital billboards and captivating news feeds. In recent years, among thousands of people entering Times Square, briefly, or routinely, its public atrium ideally accommodates wealthy, middle class, or impoverished persons, as though they're "one."

By 2015 food concessions arrived in this strip, where Bubba Gump Shrimp, and McDonald's were the only available restaurants. Times Square's visitors, eat, socialize, read, operate cell phones, and some doze off while seated in one of their hundreds colorful patio seats and tables. Some spectators between crowds watching talented Hip Hop break dancers or singers and musicians perform. Most performers earnings are evident, as some delighted spectators drop coins, but usually a dollar bill. During cold weather, it's common to spot pedestrians sitting at Times Square's patio tables - an implication that "Life is fair, inTimes Square." A smallTimes Square police precinct stays open, around the clock. Though the City limited its auto traffic in this compound, from 9:00 am, to well past midnight, its Seventh Avenue and Broadway streets and sidewalks are often crowded.

Since 1904, NYC authorities. entrepreneurs, locals and tourists aptly considerTimes Square as Manhattan's business and pleasure strip, that generates millions of dollars' per day, also derived from its influx of retail chains since 2013. Moreover, Times Square's unparalleled business' impact dates back to the dawn of the 20th Century, since Alfred Ochs, Founder/ Publisher of The New YorkTimes moved his respected newspaper, to what soon became OneTimes Square. NYC'S Mayor George McClellan, avidly renamed Longacres Square's Times Square. The first Times Square New Years; Eve ball was created and hosted by the New YorkTimes.

History chronicles how sophisticated females and dapper attired males, loved and frequented Times Square, where ModelT Fords, among luxury autos filled these streets. 1950's arrival of Eighth's Avenue's 40th to 42nd Streets New York/New Jersey's Port Authority increased Times

Square's popularity and congestion. One block away lies the Port Authority, where thousands of people enter or pass Times Square's hub, en route to their jobs or elsewhere. disrupted after the late David Rockefeller, CEO/Chairman of Chase Manhattan Bank, philanthropist and global /art collector, created his wealthy moguls, bi-partisan politicians and attorneys' think tank that restored Times Square and NYC'S fiscal stability.



In 1987, the late Rev. Wilkerson' established his spectacular, interdenominational Times Square Church. Among it's 10,000 plus congregants, some as former "at risk" Times Square New Yorkers, became devout members.

Each year Times Square's 51st Street Church, attracts thousands of international visitors, also via satellite broadcasts. About 24 years ago, Senior Pastor, Carter Conlon, was invited by the late Rev. Wilkerson, (the Church's founder and senior pastor) to join his ministry. During the mid 1990's Rev. Conlon attracted hundreds of ministers whom participated in a Day of Prayer for NYC, in Times Square.

Times Square's expanded urban renewal trajectory commenced during Mayor Dinkins' last two years.
Subsequently, NYC'S Mayor Guilani's anti-criminal campaign included his vigorous re-emergence of Times Square's commercial properties that closed their some businesses. NYC Mayor Bloomberg further upscaled Times Square and Mayor DiBlasio increased Times Square's appeal with colorful and hundreds of modern patio furnishings.





A week later with Luger's invite, the charming, Italian Laravista/Broadway Joe's Restaurant Row venue's fresh







Hip Hop's popularity. previously dominated by West Coast rappers, was also rivaled by Biggy's Junior Mafia hit, certifying that East Coast Hip Hop nationally prevails

Although missed by millions worldwide, Biggy the St. James Place Brooklyn virtuoso, rap icon native, still inspires millions of fans to accept how his extradordinary wisdom and music impacted and never left us, often shown when not-too-crowded dance floors, become too-crowded, when DJs spin Biggy's Life After Death, single released weeks after his tragedy, Life after Death was Hip Hop's first Diamond single. According to Wikipedia, over 13 million albums and 17 million Biggie Small's legacy records were sold.

WHY MOVIE PASS MUST LAST



When one thinks of the fledging MoviePass' subscription based company attracting over two million U.S. movie theaters' subscribers in seven years, the words: phenomenal success may surface, before becoming familiar with their history. However, African Americans Stacy Spikes and Helmet Watts' recognition as eminent founders of MoviePass, in 2011, currently the 21st Century's leading movie theater network never prospered from returns on their investments.

On the bright side initially providing one film per day, monthly MoviePasses for their \$50 monthly subscription plan's generous allowance, many of their frequent three films per week subscribers saved hundreds of dollars per month, attending movies nearly for free. Accordingly AMC, the world's largest movie chain franchise initially resisted participation, while Regal and other American large franchise movie houses increased revenues with MoviePass customers, during this expanded era since the late 1990's when movie attendance began dramatically declining.

Helios and Matheson Analytics' said to be haphazardly financially risky, costly, recent acquisition of 91.6% of MoviePass, as their parent company, seemed inevitably necessary to keep MoviePass solvent.

Currently facing various lawsuits Helios and Matheson reduced MoviePass' monthly subscription rate to \$9.95 from \$50, as revealed to NYGB by a MoviePass customer



Stacey Spikes, MoviePass Founder service phone representative. Movie Pass' New York City offices confirmed that Movie Pass' new owners scaled MoviePass' subscribers attendance to three major motion picture films per month. However, major movie houses still overwhelmingly benefit from Movie Pass' free marketing, promotions and customers, without honoring any financial obligation to Movie Pass that pays theaters full ticket prices for their subscribers.

Apparently Movie Pass limited it's success by not receiving a mere \$100 monthly movie theater administrative fee. Barely operating on their once \$50 per month, one film per day revenues through the first quarter of 2018. While MoviePass generated over \$50 million dollars via subscriptions their operating costs sky rocketed. If 2,000 participating U.S. theaters among approx. 5,500 U.S. movie houses paid MoviePass a \$100 monthly registration fee, Movie Pass would have generated an additional \$200,000 operating capital per month, offsetting their customer's overused movie subscriptions costs. "How 2 Million People Loved MoviePass Nearly to Death," published by Bloomberg News in May 2018 raises the issue regarding whether Spikes and Watts' vision, to satisfy their intent to altruistically generate minimal profits for their firm, while increasing profits for America's declining movie theater attendance?

Similarly, while MoviePass struggles

to stay afloat, AMC and Cinemax have already introduced similar movie discount subscriptions to their customers, after reaping such rewards from Movie Pass.

An educated and wise mother, Ms. Campbell also featured on Fire's hit single, by Chops Tha Savior (STR4L), explains, "In my quest to become the woman I was created to be, I often felt, as if I was drowning. I had to fight to stay alive, but I didn't drown...I kept going." Her difficult experiences highlight Bloody Waters' name.

Producer Stanley Ipkiss plans to add more Gail Campbell's originals, she performs live promoting her music throughout the U.S. She was a featured performer at Newark's Summer of 2018 Annual 24 Hours of Peace Concert. "With this debut EP, Gail Campbell is in her own lane.... and others will have to run to try to catch-up to where she is," says Andre McCray Cestque-Trust aka FACE from local NJ station, 8 Squad Rebel Radio. 

Carlos Lopez, Jr's Education and Legal Fund



It's an "essential must" to send Carlos Lopez, Jr. to a private college prep school, subsequent, top tier accredited university, and Disney World, (that he's requested since 2014) as a deserving youth scholar. However, several static legal and financial matters must be resolved for Carlos Lopez, Jr., his grandmother, Mrs. Caroline Lopez, and her family, also enabling Carlos Lopez, Jr. to fulfill his educational and legal goals.

In June 2003 Carlos Lopez, Jr.'s distraught mother's critical and severe mourning continued during his hospital stay. May 1, 2003, a month before her June 8, 2003 C-Section birth of Carlos Lopez, Jr., his 19 years' young father, Carlos Lopez, Sr., her fiance, was mistakenly and fatally shot by a New York City (NYC) police officer, chasing another Black male. Shortly after his childbirth, Carlos Lopez, Jr.'s mother, too emotionally unprepared to raise her infant, received what some may consider divine intervention from his grandmother, Mrs. Caroline Lopez, who raised him since childbirth, among her surviving five children in their urban Brooklyn apartment.

The Pastor of their Saint Martin of Tours Catholic Church in Brooklyn, NYC's regretful letter acknowledges the tragic loss of Carlos Lopez, Sr., as their Church's wise, thoughtful and kind usher and choir boy.

Traditionally, he and his siblings were devoted members of Saint Martin of Tours Roman Catholic Church. Mrs.

Lopez's siblings, including her husband and she, and her parents were married at Saint Martin of Tours Catholic Church.

Keenly attentive since his kindergarten years, Carlos Lopez, Jr. is notably gifted and talented. As 2017's Eighth Grade Class Salutatorian, at Brooklyn's Stephen D. Catur's School, his scholarly awards include science, algebra, sports, hygiene, etc. Carlos Lopez, Jr. is also a rare student recipient of 2017's United Federation of Teachers' (UFT) Awards. Already envisioning himself as a lawyer, his creativity peaks, shown with his initiative that created his photos featuring his father's legal case. Though Carlos Lopez, Jr.'s popularity is remarkable, noted with his social skills and wittiness, his close friends refuse to ignore him when detecting Carlos Lopez, Jr.'s lengthy solemn moments.

In 2004, a famous Black criminal attorney's endearing compassion entailed retaining Carlos Lopez, Sr.'s case, Pro-Bono. Unfortunately, the following year that attorney passed. By 2014, they depleted the Lopez's legal research expenses.

By late 2014, National Allotment Insurance and The Number One Star Corporation helped Mrs. Lopez raised \$10,000 for the release of Carlos Lopez, Sr.'s legal transcript from the respected law firm, presented the matter to Brooklyn's Federal Court, concluding Carlos Lopez, Sr.'s innocence. This 14-1/2 years frustrating intriguing case lingers.

During and since those 10 years that elapsed before and after Carlos Lopez, Sr.'s case was heard in 2014, too few NYC lawyers nor civic leaders expressed interest in trying a case previously handled by that famous attorney, without reviewing Carlos Lopez, Sr.'s case transcript.

To date, Mrs. Lopez still seeks means to legally accept NYC'S compensation award for her grandson, resulting from Carlos Lopez, Sr.'s tragedy. A few years ago, Mrs. Lopez strongly resisted a City Agency's temporary removal of Carlos Lopez, Jr., from her household, following her health and domestic crisis. Instead she should be a recipient of mothers destined for Mother of the Year Awards, as an exemplary mother, and grandmother, resiliently healthier than her asthmatic and occasional blood pressure issues. Her soft spoken courageous wisdom and charm is respectfully that of a mother of five, whose husband passed a few years ago.







The Ark of Return, a sculpture that represents the spirit of the men, women, and children who lost their lives in the transatlantic slave trade, located at the UN Headquarters in New York City, is a deliberate contrast to the Door of No Return through which enslaved Africans were brought to the Americas against their will.

As she received a tour of the House of Slaves, perhaps Mother Moon thought about the painful history of slavery. She could imagine and feel the hearts of the mothers of Africa whose children were ripped from their arms and their homes. Perhaps she could also imagine the pain of the mothers of the Americas whose children were sold and beaten as they watched. When visiting the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History in Washington D.C. back in 2017, she saw illustrations and read documents on the extreme conditions under which millions of African people were transported through the middle passage and into slavery. Perhaps she thought back to that visit as she saw the rooms in the House of Slaves where those families were separated.

On Gorée Island, she prayed, "Christianity did not know your deep will or Jesus' essence and they left a sorrowful history here in Africa and on Gorée Island. Where did Jesus' words of 'Love your neighbor as yourself' go? How could they treat people in this way because of differences in skin color? Please remember the people of Africa who have endured and waited for more than five hundred sorrowful years."

GLOBAL VIEWS & TRAVEL

Just one pivotal moment of that history includes the night of the 23rd of August 1791, when men and women torn from Africa and sold into slavery, revolted against the slave system in Saint-Domingue (now Haiti) to obtain freedom and independence. This uprising set in motion the abolition of the Slave Trade.

On December 18, 2007, the UN General Assembly agreed to establish a permanent memorial to the memory of the victims of the transatlantic slave trade on the grounds of the UN Headquarters in New York City. Paulette Bethel, the then UN Ambassador of the Bahamas addressing the assembly on behalf of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM), introduced the draft resolution that launched the process. The resolution 62/122 of December 18th, 2007 was adopted without a vote, declared the 25th of March the International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade, to be observed annually. The UN General Assembly, also, agreed to establish a Decade for People of African Descent beginning in 2015 until 2024.

Mother Moon, understanding the painful history of Africa but focusing on the magnificence of the African continent, said in Senegal, "Today, with the heart of a True Mother, and a True Parent, I have come here to pray and eradicate the historical pain that this continent has endured, so that this continent can stand once again in the providence of God and begin a new history", a history of peace, equality and true love.



African American and Asian Teachers at WFWP'S Schools of Africa

Women's Federation for World Peace, WFWP, Supports Children and Families in Africa

Mother Moon's recent visit to Gorée Island is part of a lifelong legacy of love and service practiced by her and her late husband, Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon. They have expressed their deep love for those in need through the many organizations they founded, including Women's Federation for World Peace, WFWP, In the early 90s, they

commissioned 1600 volunteers from WFWP Japan to serve in underdeveloped nations. With willing hearts, these women went to the poorest nations, to neighborhoods in every corner of the world. They started schools, fed the undernourished, and worked to empower women.

Inspired by their dedication and the legacy of our founders, WFWP USA initiated the "Schools of Africa" project to financially support nine schools founded by those faithful volunteers in eight countries in Africa. Each year, WFWP chapters across the country hold dynamic and creative fundraisers for the Schools of Africa. Fundraising events may take the form of tag sales, silent auction galas, or luncheons that celebrate African food and culture.







One Hope Garden Ethiopia

Since 2002, thanks to many generous donors, WFWP USA has sent over \$410,000 to the schools. This invaluable support has helped the schools purchase critical materials for lessons and provide scholarships to impoverished students. Contributions from WFWP USA has also supported school feeding programs, expanded and improved facilities, and paid for skilled staff. Many of the schools operate in the poorest neighborhoods, and have come to serve as a source of stability to their communities.

One mother of nine daughters in Ethiopia shared how the WFWP school, One Hope Garden, helped her family through difficult times. Senegalese could hear in it Baba Maal's voice, one of their famous national musician and also sounds of "Tama", a Senegalese traditional music Instrument in the Fulani tribe. Ivorian were charmed to admire their brothers, Bambadjan Bamba and the very respected Isaach de Bankole carrying on his lips a strange wide wood jewel, existing in Ethiopia, and Mursi & Surma people living in the south in the Omo valley. In Kenya, her native country, when three of her daughters were in school at One Hope Garden, Mrs. Thsehevi became ill, leaving their family in financial difficulty. Her eldest daughter offered to leave school and work as a housemaid in the Middle East to support the family. After agonizing overt he decision, Mrs. Thseheyi consulted with the school principal Mrs. Bisrat. Mrs. Bisrat offered to personally support and take care of them, and advised that her daughter continue her studies. Now, many years later, the eldest daughter studies construction engineering at a national college. Her second eldest daughter completed 12 years of schooling and works in the Korean Embassy in Ethiopia, and the third daughter is in 9th grade. Mrs. Thseheyi is recovered from her illness, and is currently attending the One Hope School Literacy Class for mothers. She is incredibly grateful for One Hope Garden, which has personally cared for and transformed her family's situation over many years.

From Nigeria to South Africa, via Côte d'Ivoire, Senegal, Benin, Gabon, people rushed to see King Tchalla, the Wakanda kIngdom black super-hero. February 28, 2018, entailed new recognition for Nigerian Ben Enwonwu, he deceased artist, who in 1974 painted Black Mona Lisa, in three versions, all which were stolen. In 2017 one of his paintings was recovered in London. by the Director of African Modern Art at Bonhams' Auction House. Giles Pieppiat was contacted by a family member. Enwonwu also nicknamed a painting Tutu, the African Joconda, representing Yoruba Princess Ife Adetutu, a peace back symbol for Nigeria's post 1960s Civil War.

Bomani Tyehimbra: Americans return to the U.S. transformed by an incredible energy regarding African pride. Things are made clear and lots of thoughts occur in their minds, such as living or conducting business in Africa. Their minds open because they see Africa's beauty and great potential. They share their excitement and experience to encourage others to visit Africa. Some have moved there. Others plan for the future. The full program connects then to the journey of a lifetime.

Abu-Jahlil Astrid Chacha: Reveal a few strong examples of those who successfully invested.


